# Purpose

OzHarvest's mission is to 'Nourish our Country' by preventing good food from going to waste and distributing it to charities supporting needy individuals. They achieve this by gathering quality surplus food from various donors, including supermarkets, cafes, delis, restaurants, corporate kitchens, airlines, hotels, and other food-related businesses.

OzHarvest operates nationally with offices in Sydney, Adelaide, Brisbane, Gold Coast, Cairns, Canberra, Melbourne, Newcastle, and Perth. They also rely on a dedicated team of volunteers in regional communities to carry out their mission.



OzHarvest is committed to tackling food waste and protecting the environment. They lead the way in sustainability efforts, aiming to inspire and collaborate with others to reduce food waste by half before 2030. They work closely with industry and government partners and use the media to raise awareness about this important issue.

### Description

Green Leaf Café can get involved by contributing excess perishable and frozen food, such as dairy, fish, meat, and fresh juice, as long as it's still safe for human consumption, even if it's nearing or has reached its 'use-by date.' Additionally, they can donate non-perishable items, even if they are up to three months past their 'best before date.'

Donating high-quality surplus food not only helps Green Leaf Café minimise waste and reduce disposal costs but also makes a significant positive impact by providing much-needed assistance to individuals in your local community.

#### Purpose

Clean Up Australia inspires and mobilises communities to improve and conserve our environment, eliminate litter and end waste.

Today's Clean Up Australia focuses as much on preventing rubbish from entering our environment as it removes what has already accumulated.

# Description

There are several ways that Green Leaf Café can get involved with Clean Up Australia:

- 1. Green Leaf Café staff engagement and team-building event
  - Engage the staff in a fun, practical volunteering day
  - Enjoy the outdoors and improve our local environment
  - Involve staff, customers and stakeholders
  - Grow relationships with the community through shared experiences.
- 2. Fight Food Waste. Cooperative Research Centre has identified that nearly 300kgs of food is wasted in Australia per person per year. Ways Green Leaf Café can reduce this is by:

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- Growing our own herbs and using them in the café
- Storing food correctly so that it does not spoil
- Educating staff on Best-Before and use-by dates
- Taking an inventory of food on hand and using FIFO for food rotation.
- Donate leftover food to a charity.
- 3. Educate staff on what can be recycled.
  - Recycle Aluminium Foil, Foil trays and foil pie plates
  - Flatten cardboard boxes
  - Rinse containers to remove excess debris
  - Purchase products that include the Australian recycling label.

# Commitment required

1. For a Green Leaf Café staff engagement and team-building event to take place, the cafe needs to proactively promote the event within the cafe to staff, customers, and stakeholders.

Additionally, there is a hosting cost of \$200. This cost includes clean-up bags for recycling and general rubbish, gloves, a supervisor's vest, and a sharps container. Funding for this expense could be secured by contacting stakeholders and customers.

 To actively combat food waste, Green Leaf Café's involvement would include ensuring their staff is well informed about the best practices in food hygiene and handling. While there could be some initial expenses if Green Leaf Café decides to grow its own herbs for use in the cafe, it's important to note that these costs can be offset by reducing the need to purchase herbs for cafe operations.

- 3. To actively engage Green Leaf Café in promoting awareness and education for improved recycling practices in the workplace, they could implement these no-cost changes:
  - Place clear and informative signage on recycling bins.
  - Dedicate a specific time during staff meetings to discuss recycling.
  - Establish and communicate sustainability goals for the team to work toward.
  - Recognise and reward employees who actively participate in recycling efforts.
