





Social Needs: While animal is more independent, they still require social interaction with humans and sometimes other animals. Socialisation from a young age is beneficial. Activity Needs: Enrichment activities like puzzle feeders, climbing trees, and exploration of new environments keep animal mentally and physically stimulated.
