

Scenario



You are an animal care attendant at Happy Paws Animal Care Facility.
The following services are available:

- Animal Housing
- Emergency Hospital (domestic and rural animals)
- Rescue and Adoption Centre
- Daycare
- Grooming
- Training School

You are allocated your responsibilities for the day, you are an all-rounder, meaning you work in every department. Every day you report to the main office where you are allocated your role and work for the day.

The following questions will be based on your role and the work you may encounter in a variety of animal care environment.

Question 21: A dog was hit by a car and has been brought into the Emergency Hospital. The Vet has come to assess the dog. Whilst waiting to see if its owner comes in to collect the dog, we will need to put it into the Animal Housing. Before we transfer the dog there, you have been tasked to check the dog over and see if there are any hygiene issues that need to be addressed.

What steps do you take?
